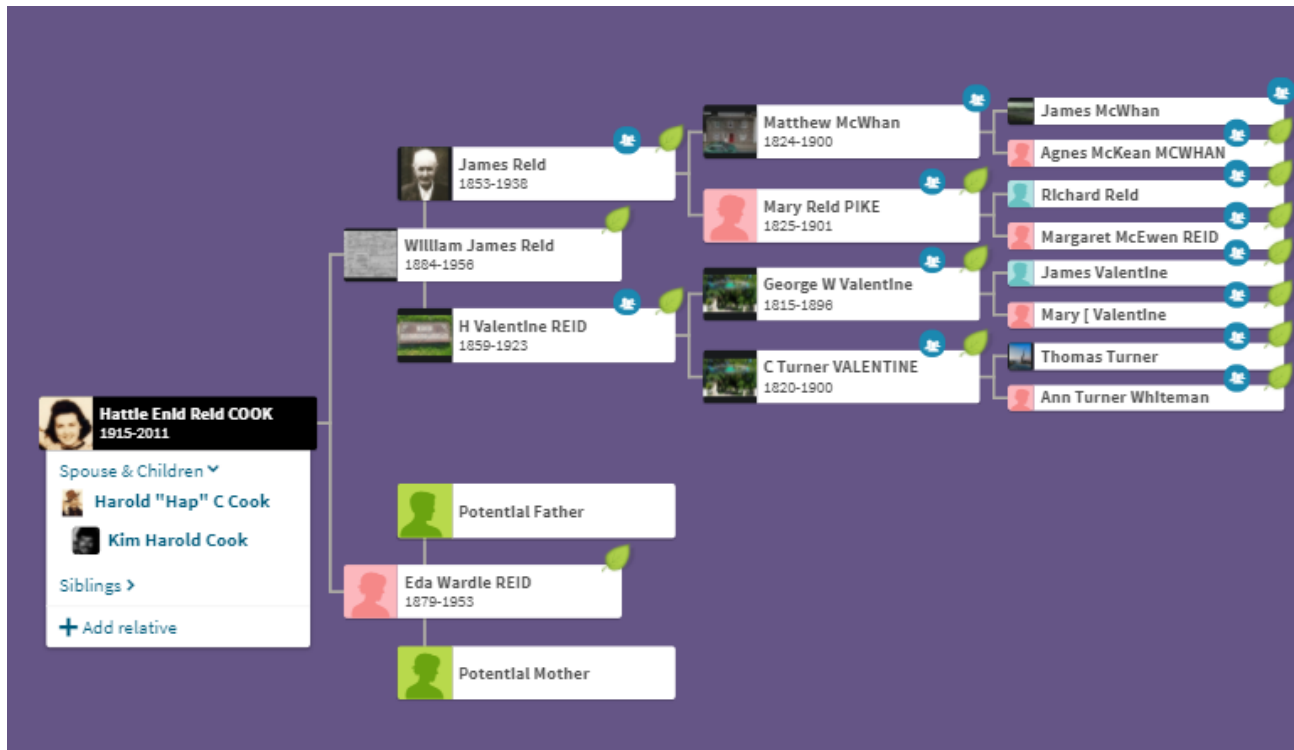

Obituary of Enid Reid Cook

Hattie Enid R. Cook, mother, grandmother, and great-grandmother passed away on April 18, 2011 in Orem, Utah. She was born Aug.13, 1915 at home in Vernal to William J. and Eda Wardle Reid. She attended Glines Elementary and graduated from Uintah High School.

She married Harold "Hap" Cook on Oct. 22, 1939. Their marriage was later solemnized in the Salt Lake LDS Temple on Oct. 8, 1964. She lived most of her life in Vernal, except for a few years in Rangely, Colo.

Enid filled her life with family, church, service, music, poetry, and crafts. She was active in the LDS Church serving in many stake and ward callings She served as a captain of the Daughter of Utah Pioneers. She worked for J.C. Penny for 26 years, then for Hatch River Expeditions until her retirement. She taught piano lessons for years. Enid spent the last four years at an Orem BeeHive home.

She is survived by her two foster daughters; Gayla Hecka Thorn, and Connie Lynn, many grandchildren and great-grandchildren, and many beloved nieces and nephews.

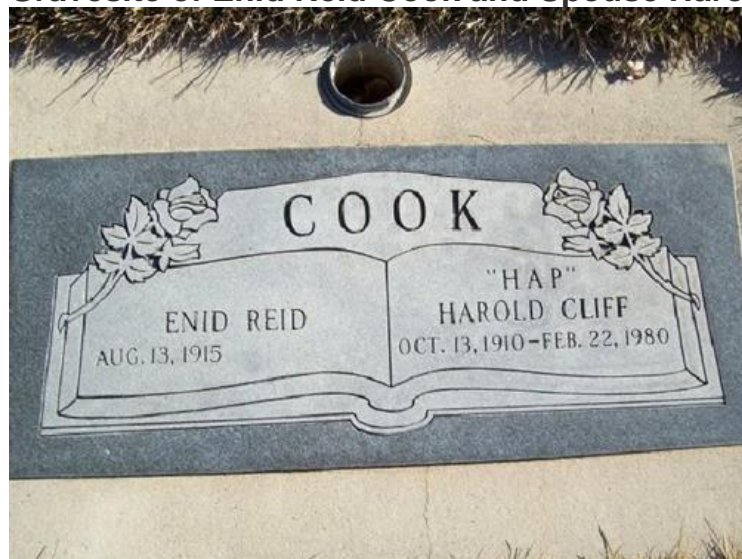
Enid is preceded in death by her parents, husband; Hap, and son; Kim.
